Makuya Nature Reserve

You will camp in unfenced areas in the Makuya NR. This adds to the experience of the tour. You will drive in your own 4x4 vehicle and you must make provision for your own provisions, including tents and camping gear, sufficient supply of water, firewood and food.


The tour is aimed at true bush lovers and ones who enjoy the wilderness and is not designed as an obstacle course or endurance test.

Accommodation | Day 1

Activities Day 1

Morning

⇒ You travel on your own to the filling station (S22° 36' 39.1" E30° 09' 49.3") near the Tshipise Holiday Resort with your own 4x4 vehicle.

Afternoon

- \Rightarrow We meet at the filling station at 13:00.
- ⇒ Depart for the Makuya Nature Reserve at 13:30.
- ⇒ Enter the Makuya NR at the main entrance to the reserve and drive to the Pandimbele Campsite.
- \Rightarrow Set up your camp for the night.

- ⇒ Your guide makes a fire.
- ⇒ Prepare your own meal on the open fire or use your gas appliances in your vehicle.
- ⇒ Discuss the planning for the days ahead of us while sitting around the fire.
- ⇒ Relax and enjoy the sounds of nocturnal birds and animals.
- \Rightarrow It seems as if the stars are so close that you can touch them.



Makuya Nature Reserve

The reserve, which lies hidden in one of the remotest parts of Limpopo, is an adventurer's dream and carries the hopes of a community that has become involved in its conservation.

It is a relatively small reserve; its 16 000 hectares are leased from the Makuya, Mutele, and Mphaphuli tribes by the Limpopo Province.

The Luvhuvhu River where hippos, elephants and crocodiles can be spotted forms a natural divide between Makuya NR and Kruger NP. Any game happy to cross it, gains access to either. You can possibly spot elephant, hippo, buffalo, lion, hyena, otter, impala, nyala, warthog and other game. Due to the harshness of this area game is not always spotted easily.

Accommodation | Day 2

Activities Day 2

Morning

- ⇒ Make your self breakfast before we depart.
- ⇒ Take down your camp and prepare for the adventures of the day.
- ⇒ Drive slowly in a southerly direction following the rough 4x4 tracks next to the Luvuvhu River.

Afternoon

- ⇒ Find a suitable site next to the Luvuvhu River to camp (possibly Buffalo Campsite).
- ⇒ Set up your camp for the next two nights.

- \Rightarrow Your guide makes a fire.
- ⇒ Prepare your own meal on the open fire or use your gas appliances in your vehicle.
- ⇒ Discuss the adventures of the day while sitting around the fire.
- ⇒ Relax and enjoy the sounds of nocturnal birds and animals.
- ⇒ Always be prepared for the unexpected.




Makuya Nature Reserve

The northern part of the Kruger National Park is an area of unique biodiversity. It's one of the few places where fever tree forests grow side by side with forests of giant baobabs. The trees line the banks of the Limpopo and Luvuvhu rivers: the slim, pale, luminescent green trunks of the fever trees glimmering between the massive dark brown trunks of the baobabs.

Accommodation | Day 3

Activities Day 3

Morning

- ⇒ The early sounds of nature and the whiff of fresh coffee will undoubtedly tease you out of your tent!
- ⇒ Enjoy the breakfast you made yourself while overlooking the Luvuvhu River.

Rest of the day

- ⇒ Relax for the day next to the river.
- ⇒ You never know what animals will surprise you in the camp. Always keep your camera ready.
- ⇒ We will decide as a group if we want to explore a little bit more of the 4x4 trail to the south.

- \Rightarrow Your guide makes a fire.
- ⇒ Prepare your own meal on the open fire or use your gas appliances in your vehicle.
- ⇒ Discuss the adventures of the day while sitting around the fire.
- ⇒ Relax and enjoy the sounds of nocturnal birds and animals.
- \Rightarrow Always be prepared for the unexpected.



Makuya Nature Reserve

All Baobabs are deciduous trees ranging in height from 5 to 20 meters. The Baobab tree is a strange looking tree that grows in low-lying areas in Africa and Australia.

Baobab trees can grow to enormous sizes and carbon dating indicates that they may live to be 3,000 years old.

One ancient hollow Baobab tree in Zimbabwe is so large that up to 40 people can shelter inside its trunk. Various Baobabs have been used as a shop, a prison, a house, a storage barn and a bus shelter. The tree is certainly very different from any other. The trunk is smooth and shiny, not at all like the bark of other trees, and it is pinkish grey or sometimes copper coloured.

When bare of leaves, the spreading branches of the Baobab tree look like roots sticking up into the air, rather as if it had been planted upside-down. Baobabs are very difficult to kill, they can be burnt, or stripped of their bark, and they will just form new bark and carry on growing.

The African bushman has a legend that tells of the god Thora. He took a dislike to the Baobab growing in his garden, so he threw it out over the wall of Paradise on to Earth below and although the tree landed upside-down it continued to grow.

Activities Day 4

Morning

- ⇒ Enjoy the breakfast you made yourself while overlooking the Luvuvhu River.
- \Rightarrow Take down your camp.

Rest of the day

- \Rightarrow Return with the 4x4 trail next to the Luvuvhu River to the Pandimbele Campsite.
- ⇒ Visit the famous "World's View" overlooking the Luvuvhu River and the Kruger NP.
- ⇒ You never know what animals or views will be around the next bend in the road. Always keep your camera ready.

Afternoon

 \Rightarrow Set up your camp for the night.

- ⇒ Your guide makes a fire.
- ⇒ Prepare your own meal on the open fire or use your gas appliances in your vehicle.
- ⇒ Discuss the adventures of the day while sitting around the fire.
- ⇒ Relax and enjoy the sounds of nocturnal birds and animals.
- \Rightarrow Always be prepared for the unexpected.



Awelani Lodge

Awelani Lodge is situated near the Pafuri Gate (just 10 km away) at the northern section of the Kruger National Park. Situated in a 1700-hectare conservancy, Awelani provides visitors with an outstanding opportunity to walk or mountain bike through a wooded conservancy with a remarkable arrangement of trees; Baobab, Mopani and Lobombo Ironwood to name a few. Sandstone outcrops hide San and Khoi rock art and traditional Venda grain storage units.

Accommodation | Day 5

Budget Camping

We use the ablution facilities of the safari tents and electricity is available.





Activities Day 5

Morning

- ⇒ You make your last breakfast in the Makuya NR.
- ⇒ Take down your camp and prepare for the adventures of the day.


Rest of the day


⇒ You are still exploring areas within the Kruger NP and be on the lookout for animals behind bushes and around corners. Who knows, maybe you see more than the big-5 today.

Afternoon

- ⇒ We continue our 4x4 adventure journey across the foothills of the Tshamavudzi Mountain range to the Mutale River. We visit the Luvuvhu Gorge, various view points and the Mutale Falls (potholes).
- ⇒ Exit the Makuya NR at the main entrance and drive to Awelani Lodge.
- ⇒ Arrive at Awelani Lodge and you set up your camp for the night.
- ⇒ Visit some of the San and Khoi rock art sites as well as traditional Venda grain storage units.

- ⇒ Tonight you will be treated to a "Cave Braai" at Awelani Lodge.
- ⇒ Discuss the events and adventures of the tour.

The area is very remote and it is not easy to obtain tyres when damaged.

- 2 The total length of the off-road trailer/caravan may not to exceed 4,2m. The smaller the better.
- 3 It is possible that vehicles will be scratched as we are in nature. It will be nothing serious.

Place for only five 4x4 vehicles on the tour.

A minimum of three vehicles is required for the tour to take place.




