

Awelani Lodge


Awelani Lodge is situated near the Pafuri Gate (just 10 km away) at the northern section of the Kruger National Park. Situated in a 1700-hectare conservancy, Awelani provides visitors with an outstanding opportunity to walk or mountain bike through a wooded conservancy with a remarkable arrangement of trees; Baobab, Mopani and Lobombo Ironwood to name a few. Sandstone outcrops hide San and Khoi rock art and traditional Venda grain storage units.

We use the ablution facilities of the safari tents and electricity is available.





Activities Day 1

Morning

 \Rightarrow You travel on your own to Awelani Lodge with your own 4x4 vehicle.

Afternoon

 \Rightarrow Arrive at Awelani Lodge and you set up your camp for the night.

- \Rightarrow Your guide makes a fire.
- \Rightarrow Prepare your own meal on the open fire or use your gas appliances in your vehicle.
- \Rightarrow Discuss the planning for the days ahead of us while sitting around the fire.
- \Rightarrow Relax and enjoy the sounds of nocturnal birds and animals.
- \Rightarrow It seems as if the stars are so close that you can touch them.

Greater Limpopo Transfrontier Park

The Kruger National Park is the largest game reserve in South Africa.

It is roughly the same size as Israel or Wales, and covers some 20,000 square kilometres. It extends approximately 350 kilometres from north to south and approximately 60 kilometres from east to west. To the west and south of the Park are the provinces of Mpumalanga and Limpopo. In the north is Zimbabwe and to the east is Mozambique.

The Kruger National Park is now part of the Greater Limpopo Transfrontier Park (with a total area of 35 000 square kilometres). This peace park links the Kruger with Gonarezhou National Park in Zimbabwe, and with the Limpopo National Park in Mozambique.



Activities Day 2

Early Morning

- ⇒ You are now in big-5 area and expect to spot some of them as well as a lot of other animals, birds, trees, etc.
- \Rightarrow Join a guided tour to the Thulamela Ruins.

Morning

- \Rightarrow Prepare brunch at the Pafuri Picnic Site next to the Luvuvhu River.
- ⇒ Follow the trail that winds through the Fever Tree forest to Crooks Corner. Crooks Corner got its name from the outlaws who lived there in the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

Afternoon

- \Rightarrow Cross the border to Mozambique and enter the Limpopo National Park.
- \Rightarrow Drive to our camp for the next two nights.
- \Rightarrow Set up your camp for the next two nights.

- \Rightarrow Your guide makes a fire.
- ⇒ Prepare your own meal on the open fire or use your gas appliances in your vehicle.
- \Rightarrow Discuss the adventures of the day while sitting around the fire.
- \Rightarrow Relax and enjoy the sounds of nocturnal birds and animals.
- \Rightarrow Always be prepared for the unexpected.

Day 3

Pafuri Region

The northern part of the Kruger National Park is an area of unique biodiversity. It's one of the few places where fever tree forests grow side by side with forests of giant baobabs. The trees line the banks of the Limpopo and Luvuvhu rivers: the slim, pale, luminescent green trunks of the fever trees glimmering between the massive dark brown trunks of the baobabs.



- \Rightarrow Relax and enjoy the sounds of nocturnal birds and animals.
- \Rightarrow Always be prepared for the unexpected.

Day 4

Pafuri Region

The Pafuri area of the Kruger National Park is located in the northern regions of the park, near the border with Zimbabwe and Mozambique. The Limpopo and Luvuvhu Rivers converge in this birder's paradise, with over 400 species recorded including a number of rarities such as Mottled Spinetail, Pels Fishing Owl and Blue-cheeked Bee-eater.

It is particularly well-known for its spectacular geological formations as well as its fever tree forests and baobab belts under which herds of elephant feed.

The Luvuvhu River contains large crocodile, hippos and Africa's prized game fish – the Tiger Fish.

General plains game is plentiful in the region, most notably along the Luvuvhu River's floodplains. Although not as densely populated with the larger predators as the south of the Kruger, the Pafuri is especially loved by those looking for a wilderness experience away form the crowds of tourists that visit the southern and central Kruger.

Accommodation | Day 5

Budget Camping

Awelani Lodge is situated near the Pafuri Gate (just 10 km away) at the northern section of the Kruger National Park. Option 2: Camp at Awelani Lodge again tonight. The activities below are applicable when you decide to make use of the Awelani Lodge facilities for tonight.


Rest of the day

- \Rightarrow Visit some of the San and Khoi rock art sites as well as traditional Venda grain storage units.

- ⇒ Tonight you will be treated to a "Cave Braai" at Awelani Lodge.
- \Rightarrow Discuss the events and adventures of the tour.


